The program is designed to assist individuals who have fled persecution, violence, or other hardships in their home countries and have sought refuge in the United States. Here are the key aspects of the PC REA Program:

Targeted Populations Served

The PC REA Program extends its services to various immigrant groups, including but not limited to:

Refugees: Individuals who have been granted refugee status due to a well-founded fear of persecution.

Asylees: Those who have been granted asylum in the United States based on persecution or fear of persecution in their home countries.

HHP (Humanitarian Parolee) and UHP (Urgent Humanitarian Parolee): Individuals granted parole into the United States for humanitarian reasons.

Cuban/Haitian Parolees: Individuals granted parole status from Cuba or Haiti.

Afghan Parolees: Afghan nationals granted parole status in the United States.
